No one can match the magic of a Grandma in the kitchen. Human Beans want to document the recipes of the Grandmothers across the world. Fast-UK and **folly** have invited them to start in Lancaster.

The artists are encouraging people to create home videos of their Grandmas cooking the family's favourites in their own kitchen and share their wisdom and stories. Anyone who can get their hands on a camera and a computer can participate - you can even make a video on your mobile phone if you want. All videos should be uploaded to www.WhatsCookingGrandma.net.

And if that's all too much don't worry - Human Beans are also offering film your grandma for you, for free - they'll even buy the ingredients.
